NKG KITE BUILDING COMPETITION

Update:

I believe we already have a few contenders jostling for position in the Kite building competition at the AGM, and i'm hoping to get something a little different built myself, but as time is short, if you cant get your kite flown at the November or December fly-ins we will accept a test fly on the day of the AGM if you can find space to do so...

At the AGM in January Gwen proposed a new kitemaking competition and I furnished a few rules hopefully keeping it simple and fun.

The kite to be made is a Pearson Roller which has a top and a bottom sail, a keel on the lower sail and a two point bridle, you can find plans in several places including the NKG web site.

The kite must be made and fly during the year at any NKG fly-in or other event attended by the NKG and you need an NKG committee member to verify this (If you can also provide a photo of the kite for the Magazine that would be good too) and then final judging will take place at the AGM next January based on build quality and presentation and scored on how well it flew by the committee member who verified it.

Applique on the sail is allowed so feel free to add any designs you wish, if you prefer to go for a plain sail however you wont lose any points for this. Any materials can be used to make the kite and any size is acceptable (As long as it fits in the hall) All kites will be voted on anonymously by members who want to vote at the AGM on a simple choice of which kites they like most and then the flight scores will be added to these to get a final result.

I hope the new style of competition will bring us some great Rollers to look at over the course of the year, and I look forward to seeing them all at the AGM in January.

DIEPPE INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL - WITH AND WITHOUT KITES

Ferries booked, car and caravan packed to bursting point, and off we go, the Kiteflyer and I. Our annual sojourn in France began this year at the start of September with a week's stay near Granville at the foot of the Cotentin peninsula. Beautiful old towns, pretty villages and miles of white sandy beaches. Perfect for relaxing with a good book whilst the Kiteflyer flew kites. 50 miles away was Mont St Michel with the 1500 year old abbey clinging to the summit, an excellent day out.

Then eastwards to the Dieppe International Kite Festival in its 30th year.

Our base La Source is a campsite ten minutes from Dieppe set on the bank of a fast flowing river. It offers, as they say, every mod con including a heated swimming pool.

Saturday dawned bright and clear and a difficult choice had to be made: the opening ceremony or Dieppe market? The Kiteflyer earned a few brownie points by suggesting that Monsieur the Mayor of Dieppe would not notice our absence and we spent a couple of hours fascinated by the wonderful market selling the freshest fruit and veg imaginable as well as meat and fish – very good on the BBQ, and a vast array of clothes and bric a brac. By the time we got to the sea front where the kite arenas had been laid out things were, both in the literal and figurative senses hotting up. There were sun, wind and kites galore waiting for us.

Peter Lynn's giant inflatables filled the beach, single line kites of all shapes and sizes filled one arena and a succession of two line displays was taking place in another. A 'wind-art' area showed whirligigs, bottle art and 'wind music' with a kite making marquee for the children. Thousands of people strolled in the sunshine agog at the spectacle laid out before them. Fifteen white dragon kites were launched to represent each of the festivals already held. Think Sunderland, think Silloth, think Woodvale and then multiply by twenty or even fifty.

This 9 day festival is held in France every other year and a guest country is invited to send a larger delegation including entertainers. This year, the 30th year of the festival, the honour went to Thailand who provided music and dancers to entertain the crowds with traditional Thai dance and beautiful costumes.

Over the next four days until we left for Chester the wind rose and fell as did the kites, but the band of brothers and sisters from some 40 countries represented continued to work hard, providing as fine a display as possible for the public who included many parties of school children and disabled, all spellbound by the variety of shape and colour flying above them. Each country had a marquee in which to display their kites and kite making skills.

The Kiteflyer spent time in the Oriental kite sales tents and I enjoyed a stroll along the harbour and through the town, calling at the magnificent old church in the town centre and then returning to watch the brilliant flying of the multinational group of kiters, my favourites as always Ray Bethel flying three two liners at once and Lam Hok who shows such skill and beauty in flying both two and four line kites.

The organisation was spot on with each act standing by to perform as soon as the previous one had finished – no empty arenas. All the kiters moved both kites and lines as soon as they had finished – no messy tangles in the arena.

A huge festival, well organised with the public in mind in a beautiful seaside setting. What more could The Kiteflyer and I ask for?

The World Sport Kite Championship is the most representative competition in the sport-kiting world. The competition is held in 2-line and 4-line kite classes for individual, pairs and teams.

Participants are selected by the national sport kiting organizations represent STACK in UK, France, Germany, Italy, Spain, The Netherlands, Belgium, Luxemburg, Russia.

Organizers: S.T.A.C.K.

Format:

The Competition is running using the International Sport Kite Rule Book. The Championship consists of two days of full competition - precision and ballet disciplines. Historically the primary competition days are Friday and Saturday. Sunday is the reserve competition day.
